You are invited to apply for the **Young Alumni Advisory Council** (YAAC) of The Association of Former Students. The mission of the council is to actively promote and enhance the mission, values, and vision of Texas A&M University and The Association of Former Students by assisting and serving the needs of recent graduates through professional development, community service, social networking, and philanthropic endeavors.

The term "Young Alumni" is the generic industry term used to identify recent graduates from an institution of higher education. We consider Young Alumni to be any former student who has attended, or graduated from, Texas A&M University within the past 10 years, in addition to the calendar year we are currently in (*Class of 2004 - 2013 and 2014*). As of April 1, 2014, this demographic makes up 31 percent of all living former students.

As official volunteers of The Association of Former Students, the Young Alumni Advisory Council is made up of 15 regional representatives, 19 council members and three committee chairs for a total of 37 members. The duties of YAAC members are outlined in their respective committee's scope of work and also include a financial contribution to The Association, participation in Young Alumnispecific programming, representation of the Council and The Association at local A&M Club events, and performing any other duties necessary for the successful execution of the mission.

Young Alumni Advisory Council members:

- Will be chosen from a variety of ages and graduation years within this demographic, with as much diversity as possible
- Should be available to meet in College Station three times in 2015
- Will be responsible for costs associated with attending meetings in College Station
- Will be responsible for assisting in the development and implementation of council activities and programs in conjunction with The Association of Former Students

The deadline for submitting applications is July 31, 2014. Elected council members will be notified and announced in the fall of 2014.
